Royal Highball Cocktail

Legend has it that the Royal Highball cocktail was developed by renowned Ritz barman Frank Meier in honor of King Alfonso at the opening of the Ritz bar, in 1921 in Paris. The festive, yet strong sparkler is made from Cognac, Champagne, and muddled strawberries. In acknowledgement of King Alfonso's seemingly limitless appetite of Champagne and spirits, Meier would serve the cocktail in a large highball glass, nearly double the size of a typical Champagne flute.
