

Following its inauguration in 1927 by King George V and Queen Mary, The May Fair Hotel became London society's playground. The young and affluent whirled around the ballroom alongside royalty, providing an oasis of enjoyment for guests to forget the outside world once the war came. During the fifties and sixties under the ownership of Hollywood's Danziger brothers, the hotel became a theatrical showpiece in itself. A private cinema and theatre were built, alongside a pool bar housing real caiman crocodiles.



TALKING POINTS

Lobby/Hotel History

- The plaque in the lobby commemorates when The May Fair was opened in 1927 by King George V and Queen Mary, who toured and approved it before opening to the public. It was the first hotel to open in London for 20 years.
- The blue plaque on the hotel's exterior pays homage to Bert Ambrose, a dance band leader who lived and played here between 1927 and 1940.
- In the 1950s, the hotel was bought by the Danziger brothers, two Hollywood film producers. They built a cinema for the local community
- which still stands today
- plus a bar with waterfalls and real caiman crocodiles.
- The hotel has for several years running been a partner to BFI Film Festival and The Official Hotel of London Fashion Week, which means you often spot celebrities and Hollywood stars walking around the hotel.


