# Staff Event Activities



Floral activities are perfect for a staff party or event, bringing colour, creativity and the beauty of flowers to the occasion. There are many options for the format of the activity depending on your objectives for the day.

Do you want to give staff a challenge or let them relax and get creative? Or maybe it's a more chilled vibe? There is something to suit all and we are happy to discuss any other ideas you might have.

# Format Options

The format for the activity can be customised to meet your objectives for the day. Here are the most popular but please do let us know if you have any other inspiration!

## **Creative - Individual**

Each attendee completes their own floral creation, with demonstration and guidance by the tutor.

## **Creative - Team**

Small teams complete a joint floral creation, with demonstration and guidance by the tutor.

## Game-style


"Generation game" style where the tutor demonstrates creating an arrangement in full and staff must replicate this to the best of their ability in a set time. This could be done on an individual or team basis and introduces a fun, competitive element to the day.

### Informal

If a more relaxed vibe is desired rather than an organised activity, then a flower bar works really well. Staff can go to the flower bar at their leisure and select flowers to create their own posie, with guidance and assistance from the tutor.

### Remote

If you would like to include staff who are remote and can't join in person on the day, that's no problem. We can send them a kit in advance of the event so that they can join in by video conference on the day. This option is more suitable for silk flowers.



When choosing the type of floral arrangement for your activity, here are the things to consider.

- Level of difficulty do you want something easy and fun or something more challenging?
- Time how much time do you want to allocate?
- Aesthetic appeal what will appeal to the majority of staff?
- Fresh or silk flowers silk will be easier to take home or to the office and will last but some people just prefer the beauty of fresh flowers.
- Individual or team-based activity.

Note: colours and flower selections will be based on availability at the time.

### Activity Options



#### **Floral Envelope**

An ideal option for an individual creation, easy and quick to complete. It is also an ideal size for displaying on a desk or indeed at home. *Level of difficulty - Easy.* 

#### Zinc Pot

Another ideal option for an individual creation, easy and relatively quick to complete. Again, it is an ideal size for your desk or home. *Level of difficulty - Easy.* 





#### **Floral Handbag**

A very pretty design, still small in scale and easy to display. Level of difficulty - Easy.

#### **Floral Hatbox**

A floral hatbox makes a beautiful display as you learn the techniques of the posie design in floral arrangement.

Level of difficulty - Easy to Medium.



## **Activity Options**





#### **Flower Crowns and Corsages**

Flower crowns and either lapel or wrist corsages are an option that may suit. Can be a little trickier to work with! Level of difficulty - Medium.

#### **Petite Hand-tied Bouquet**

If you would like to learn the techniques to create your own hand-tied bouquet with fresh flowers then this one is for you.

Level of difficulty - Medium to Difficult.





#### **Door Wreath**

If you really want to challenge staff then creating a door wreath might be the option. This would take approximately 3 hours. Level of difficulty - Difficult.

Whatever format and activity you choose, your staff are sure to enjoy the opportunity to take part in a fun activity where they will be immersed in the beauty of flowers and can get creative either individually or within a team.
